FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR LARRY EUBANKS

How would you describe God's love? Unconditional is one way. Amazing, unbelievable, irrerepressible, inconceivable, indescribable, uncontainable, untameable, unlimited—these have all been used to describe God's love.

Which are ways to describe his nature, since we say that God is love.

Okay, that was relatively easy. Now, describe the love that is displayed in most churches. Love within the church, among the members. Love that is expressed outward from the toward the world.

That's actually easy too. Just go back to the first paragraph and remove all the unand in-prefixes.

Believable. Repressible. Conceivable. Describable. Contained. Tame. Limited. And that's on our good days.

On a lot of days, love within some churches is hard to find. What is found instead is bitterness, fear, grudge-holding, and barely-contained hostility.

Even if that is only true in the most dysfunctional of churches, it's often been true throughout the history of the church. Christianity has not always reflected the true nature of our God.

And that's what we are—image-reflectors. If it's true—and it is—that we bear the image of God generally and the image of Christ specifically, it is also true that we also reflect on their image.

In other words, what people see in us and experience from us reflects on their understanding of who God is and what his nature is like.

In a day in which most church-going Christians don't read the Bible, we can't expect people outside the church to learn of the nature of God by reading the Bible. They are going to form their ideas about God from what they see and experience from those who confess to follow him.

That's why the early church leaders who wrote letters to the churches rarely focused on matters of doctrinal correctness. In one instance when differences in belief were brought up, Paul told believers to relax a little and not let their differences divide them. It wasn't a trivial matter either, it was about idol worship and the existence of other gods. For some believers, these gods were real and eating meat that had been sacrificed to them was idolatry. For others—whom Paul calls mature—idols were just wooden objects and meat sacrificed to them was just meat. Paul didn't tell the young believers to grow up, he told the mature believers to chill out.

To let love rule the day.

James told his church that when confronted with someone who lacked adequate clothing or food not to tell them that your "thoughts and prayers" are with them, but to give them clothes and food. He says this not because prayer is ineffective, but because it's not loving enough. Love them enough to give them clothes and food.

John is just as explicit: How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action." (1 Jn 3:17-18)

Put another way, they will know we are Christians by our love, to which is the clear addendum—they will know God is love by our love.

To the extent that our love is limited, tame, represible, conceivable, describable, etc., then that is what they will conclude our God is like.

There's an old axiom that says that atheism is a parasite off of bad theism. If we present an image of God that should be rejected, it's actually smart for people to reject it. And if we present no other alternative image of God, the only thing to do is to reject the very existence of God.

We may never love as purely or as deeply as God, but that doesn't mean that we shouldn't try. The quality of our love for one another helps determine whether a person will be a God-believer or a God-rejector.

So let's shoot for love that is amazing.
