

Sorry to state the obvious, but the only people who are hungry are people who don't have food. I mean, really hungry, not the supper-is-late-and-Ihaven't eaten-since-lunch kind of hungry that most of us mean when we say, "I'm hungry."

It's important to realize that this term "righteousness" covers a lot of ground. Modern Christians tend to see it primarily in terms of moral purity and sinlessness—we are righteous when we avoid committing a sin or when we've been forgiven for a sin we've already committed. Those who have accepted Christ and become Christians have been declared righteous already. "Righteousness" certainly includes moral aspect and a status of having been declared sinless, but it is more than that.

In the Bible it is most often used in a much more basic sense, that of a person who has been denied justice finally receiving it. It's a legal term, but it covers more than just laws passed by governments. It's about a person receiving basic human needs that have been denied them-healthy food, clean water, dignity, humanity, equality. Things like that.

But what if you already have God; how can you thirst for him when you've already got him? You've accepted Christ, received forgiveness, given the status of righteous—you have everything that you need. What's there to hunger and thirst for? Yet particularly those of us who have been Christians for a long time know what it's like to still hunger and thirst for him. We remember a time when our passion for Jesus was soul-stirring, when it was on our mind when we woke in the morning and when we rested at night and practically every moment in between.

comforts of life come and we become distracted. We equate being comfortable-being filled-with being blessed, when in fact comfort tends to dull us, numb us, make us incapable of feeling hunger and thirst for God. We find ourselves going through the motions in our relationship with God, filling our lives not with God but with religious and churchy things. We even get good at going through the motions, so good that other people don't recognize that that's what we are doing. But we know.

I can be pretty single-minded when my stomach growls; all I want is to eat something. When I get thirsty enough I'll stop whatever I'm doing to get something to drink. And I'll eat and drink whatever is available. I can take care of the hunger by eating a bag of chips; I can quench my thirst by drinking a soda.

But the problem is not only that neither of these are nutritious or beneficial; the real problem is that I am no longer hungry or thirsty for what are. The only way to become hungry is to stop eating; the only way to become thirsty is to stop drinking. As long as you are filling your longing for God with other things—even religious things—you'll never hunger and thirst for him.

And if you can pretty much anytime walk to your refrigerator and have your choice of soda, filtered water, milk or fruit juice, you're not really thirsty. You just want something to drink. People who live in a desert can say they are thirsty. Or maybe in California.

So it's a bit of an issue when Jesus says that those who are hungry and thirsty for righteousness are blessed, and promises that they will be filled. Because he doesn't say that you are blessed when you are filled, but when you aren't. And most of us are filled.

But there is an even more fundamental sense to this term "righteousness." Ultimately the hungering and thirsting for righteousness is a hungering and thirsting for God, the one who is truly fair and just and merciful and forgiving, and the only one who can truly be trusted to give us those things.

O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. (Psalm
