Missions Update

February Mission Project

Beginning January 15th, you will see a Valentine Tree in the Welcome Center. The tree will be decorated with Valentines made by the children at Little Lights and will include a scripture. Grab a valentine off the tree and purchase a gift card (in any amount) to Walmart, Target, grocery store, or gas station. Once purchased, return the valentine to the box at the Welcome Desk. Be sure to include the gift card, gift card receipt, and dollar amount of the gift card. These gift cards will be donated to Heartly House and Faith House.

Heartly House provides victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse with safety, shelter, and supportive services. Faith House is a program of The Rescue Mission offering women and children shelter and a safe place to heal.

There will also be a bin for FBC and Little Lights families to place *new* mittens/gloves, scarves, hats, socks, chapstick, lotion (travel size), and hand sanitizer (travel size) there. On Sunday, February 12th during the Sunday School hour, we invite everyone to the youth classroom to help stuff bags with these supplies. These bags will be placed downtown along Carroll Creek for the homeless community to utilize.

All are welcome to help distribute the bags. Anyone interested should meet in the Welcome Center after church services. We will collect these items from January 15 to February 12.

Little Lights Childcare Center Partnership with FCPS

Frederick High School has a program within their building called the LYNX program, which provides high school students the opportunity to explore different career fields with hands-on experiences. LL has been partnering with this program since 2018. Staff from LL visits FHS to talk with students who have an interest in Early Childhood.



The students then create a lesson plan to use at a later date. The goal is to have these students come to LL to teach in the classrooms and observe how a childcare center operates.

I read with interest an article published in the Charlotte (NC) Observer on January 23, 2023 by Brian Pike (a Methodist) about his childhood church closing its doors. Fortunately, the author does note that the congregation moved to another location which I found encouraging. The church is His people, not simply a building.

Anyway, the author laments the widespread closing of church buildings due to declining numbers of members. He writes, "This downward spiral is in sharp contrast to the growth churches experienced post World War II. At that time, church planters had a 'if you build it, they will come' mentality. Churches were built and people came. Clearly, the pandemic impacted church operations and attendance. But truthfully, churches were already experiencing difficulties prior to the pandemic. Lots of data is available regarding this significant decline." Some of you may remember those post World War II days that the author speaks of. Times have surely changed.

One aspect of this decline that the author addresses is the lack of discretionary time especially among young families with children. He writes: "During my growing up years at Davis Street, the pace of the world was slower. Sundays were quiet. Only essential businesses were open. Unless there was sickness, our family was in church every Sunday. Today, our pace is entirely different. With many retail businesses open, Sunday is a popular day for shopping. But there is a busyness impacting families and the choices they make over the course of weekend. In these over-extended families, church **might not be on their top five list of planned activities**. In an article in the Spring 2022 edition of the William and Mary Alumni Magazine, Brian Shallcross, General Manager of the minor league baseball team, the Bowie Baysox [yes, that's the Bowie, MD, Baysox], talks about how his organization works to bring people to a game. When Shallcross started his career, the focus was on 'discretionary income,' the extra income a family might have to spend. Now, Shallcross states the focus is on 'discretionary time.' Marketers attempt to figure out how to persuade a family that a baseball game is the best option from the multiple options they consider during a weekend." This definitely presents a challenge for churches. But it seems to me that

families and individuals must put their priorities in order as to how they will spend their discretionary time. Are baseball and/or the myriad of other possible Sunday activities more important than worshipping God and being in fellowship with one's brothers and sisters in Christ? Do we keep our eye on the ball or turn our eyes upon Jesus? In Matthew 18:20, Jesus says, "For where two or three have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst." Though we can certainly serve God by ourselves, we are really meant to be in fellowship and in collective service to God. Missions are not one person operations. We are Light Unleashed as the body of Christ. The Book of Acts is about putting the Good News of Jesus into action. I believe we most effectively do that in fellowship and community.

I reflect on the words of Jesus in Matthew 6:21, "for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." I wonder if His statement could also be applied to how we spend our time. Where do we put our treasure of time? Does how we spend our time both collectively and individually indicate where our hearts are? Perhaps these questions are at least worth pondering.
