

Our monthly potluck dinner and fellowship will be on November 6th from 6:30-7:30 pm. There is a sign-up sheet on the Welcome Desk.






**Operation Christmas Child:** Last day to drop off is **November 24th**

#### At Our Best

I first walked into First Baptist Church as a visitor in 2001. The church was located on Dill Avenue in the old building that was dedicated in 1923. I was warmly greeted that very first day and I felt very welcome. Though I didn't start out as a regular attender, I returned every few weeks and began to attend a small group and ultimately found a church home and family. I wasn't involved with the move to our current location on Bowers Road in 2008, but I can only imagine the prayer, faith, and work it took to make such a move.

From the history I've read about First Baptist Church, we're actually in our fourth building since being founded in 1905. As we all know, the church is not a building but the body of His children worshipping together and serving Him and others as the Holy Spirit leads. Our church has been through much in its 119-year history, and we are currently in a time of transition and change which is uncomfortable at times. Christ never promised anyone that following Him would be easy (John 16:33).

I sometimes wonder what vision the thirteen original founders had for First Baptist when they came together and formed His church in Frederick. As an aside, some of the founders' descendants are still members of our church. It's certain that the founders wanted a Baptist presence in their community and likely saw themselves and the congregation reaching out to the community and helping those in need. Though it's easy to turn inward in our current circumstances we have to remember that we are to be Light Unleashed. Christ charges us under His Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20).

Since volunteer time is finite, I have thought about what we have been doing when we are at our best and using that precious time in service to our Lord and His people. Any list, fortunately, can be long. When we're at our best we're:

Planting churches. One example is Summit Trace Church that we planted in 1999. Summit Trace now worships in the building on Dill Avenue that we left.

Serving food at the homeless shelter.

Collectively leaving the building to intentionally serve our community. This was known as "The Church Leaves the Building" and small groups went to visit and serve the homeless, first responders, shut-ins, and those in nursing facilities. We haven't done this since before the pandemic.

Delivering boxed meals to those in need.

Filling shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child.

Filling boxes for expectant mothers.

Building beds for kids.

Prayerfully knitting or crocheting shawls for those that are suffering illness.

Visiting those in the hospital.

Support of local and international missionaries.

Providing backpacks with school supplies.

Providing clothing during our clothing drive at Waverly Elementary.

An intentional ministry of presence to those around us.

Home visits or follow-up calls to our visitors.

This list is by no means inclusive, and I invite you to come up with your own. What gets you excited? We need ideas so that we can run with them. We won't long be remembered for our bureaucracy and organization, but we will forever be remembered for our love and the difference we have made in people's lives, especially to "the least of these" and to the so-called unlovable (Matthew 25:34-45).
