Placing Church Needs First

As we approach a new year, I reflect on the many blessings from our Lord that we experienced as His church in 2024. We have been blessed with our Interim Pastor Duke Jeffries and his wife Sandra for nearly a year now. We continue to remain focused on Jesus and His Word and are together. We have basically maintained our attendance and are holding our own financially. We continue to have eager volunteers and vibrant committees doing His work both inside and outside of our doors. And we are blessed to have *your* ministry of presence! Jesus tells us in Matthew 18:20, "For where two or three have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst." The author of Hebrews says, "and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together as is the habit of some, *but encouraging one another*; and all the more as you see the day drawing near (Hebrews 10:24-25). Though 2024 had its challenges (as every year does), indeed, it has been a very good year! Thanks be to God!

On Sunday, January 5, 2025, we will substantially change our worship schedule and go to a single blended service from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM with small groups meeting from 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM. First Baptist Church has not regularly had a blended service for a number of years and this change in time and worship style will likely have its challenges going forward. Most of us get used to a regular routine and enjoy what we have. Prior to Covid, we couldn't have imagined the changes that the pandemic caused us to become accustomed to such as social distancing, a single service (alternating traditional and contemporary styles from week to week), and virtual meetings (which we are still doing at times). The fact is, we put our personal preferences aside out of necessity and for the good of the church collective. Your church leadership prayerfully came to the conclusion that our future is dependent on attracting new members, especially younger people, and that an 8:30 AM service is difficult for young adults with children to regularly attend. Thus, we are going forward with the new schedule. No one knows in advance how it will work out but I pray that we love each other with patience and kindness (1 Corinthians 13:4) as we effect this change with our Lord's guidance.

Though we may be comfortable in our current routines and respective worship styles (traditional or contemporary), we need to put our personal comfort and preferences behind the greater good of His church as we go into this new year. Change is difficult and can be uncomfortable but we must put God and the needs of His church first behind our personal wants. I look forward to 2025 and know there will be both challenges and opportunities requiring prayer and flexibility to follow God's guidance.

As we come to the end of the current year and see the new one ahead, I pray that we take the time to reflect on our many collective and individual blessings. I wish everyone a very happy New Year!
