Jesus' Secret Teachings

What were the secret teachings of Jesus? We will examine the texts of the Gospel of Thomas, the Gospel of Mary Magdelene, the Gospel of Judas, the Gospel of Philip and the Gospel of Truth.

The Mass, Sacred Words Set to Music

In this class we will listen to and discuss Masses written over the last seven centuries, from the earliest extant Mass composed in the 1400s by Guillaume de Machaut to contemporary composer John Rutter's "Mass of the Children."

How the Hebrew Bible was Formed

Did you know that the Hebrew Bible contains not one but two *different* accounts of Noah's Ark; Jacob being renamed Israel; Abram passing Sarai on; two different creation stories? This course will examine the present state of research into the formation and development of the Hebrew Bible.

Judaism, Jewish Peoplehood, and the Land of Israel

Together we will explore the historic connection between the Land of Israel and the Jewish people as well as the religious significance of this relationship. We will study sources that take us on a journey from the Biblical era through the centuries until we arrive at our modern age.






Volunteers for Diaper Bank

GC3 Diaper Bank is a ministry of GC3 Church right here in Frederick. GC3 Diaper Bank is a ministry founded in June 2023 that seeks to provide diapers to those who are struggling to afford them. Their goal is to bring hope to the hopeless and serve Christ by meeting a big need of families in our community. They are in need of 12-15 volunteers at each distribution, which are held twice a month, 4:30pm to 7pm on first and third Thursday nights each month. As a small church family, they are tapped for volunteer resources, and are constantly in need of more

Pulpit Committee

The Pulpit Committee has unanimously selected Don Moenich to be called to lead FBC Frederick as Senior Pastor. We feel the Holy Spirit is strong within him. Don presents the Bible as written and demonstrates incredible knowledge of the Bible. He shows commitment to his community and together with his wife they have grown churches in the past and even birthed a new one from the church growth they've experienced.

With Don as our choice, we will be getting a team. Don's wife, Liz, works full-time for an online university and together they have begun ministries to help people in their communities. We expect them to do the same for our community. Don is energetic and a great communicator. He is the only candidate who had specific ideas and a super passion to grow the congregation and community at large. Finally, Don will not be bi-vocational (this would be his only job where he will be a .80 or 4/5th-time pastor with the prayerful plan to be a full-time pastor in 12-18 months). Both he and Liz will plan to move into the community if appointed and can begin working within a reasonable timeframe.

Finally, we reviewed over two dozen resumes and interviewed six good candidates. We had three fill the pulpit and submit to second interviews. We did a Credit/Criminal Background check on the final three candidates. The committee debated the pros and cons on each candidate and while we found favor with all three candidates, we are convicted that Don Moenich is the right person for FBC at this time.

We have invited Pastor Don to Deli on the Hill on March 5th at 6:30p.m. Please stop by to meet him and his wife Liz.

FROM PASTOR DUKE

KOINONIA PART 1 of 2

Christian community thrives when all the members of the congregation are "on the same page" in matters of worship, learning, growing, loving and serving one another as they are instructed and exhorted in Holy Scripture by their pastors and teachers (*Ephesians* **4:11:14**). The unity that results is captured in the Greek term transliterated in the New Testament as *koinonia*, which can be defined as "fellowship or communion with God and with one another".

Koinonia runs deeper than mere comradery, and is more complex and demanding than mere church membership. Koinonia is the essential unity of believers: the result of the biblical truth that every authentic Christian is baptized into the body of Christ – the Church – by the Holy Spirit who indwells all of us. This Spiritenabled unity is, if you will, also a

gift of the Spirit. But like all spiritual gifts, it must be energized by the will of its recipient. Koinonia will stop being just a documented biblical truth and start being a vital, life-changing personal experience in the local church only when the members of that church – by reason of their collective and individual wills – release the Spirit's power in acts of Christian community.

The very first church, which came together after the apostle Peter's famous sermon on the Day of Pentecost (*Acts* 2:1-41), provides a striking example of *koinonia* in practice, as recorded later in the Book of *Acts*:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.
